Information, Reports and Recommendations

*2010-2011 Career and Technical Education Plan

Dr. Hazel Frick presented the following policies for 30day review: Policy 4335, Criminal Behavior – A new provision required by the State Board of Education has been included requiring the principal or designee to notify the parents or guardians of students who are alleged to be victims of any of the seventeen reportable offenses; Policy 7410, Career Status - Included in the policy is information stating that a teacher has the right

to a hearing before the board of education if the superintendent recommends that career status should not be granted; Policy 7950, Probationary Teachers: Non Renewal – This is a new proposed policy designed to address statutory changes regarding probationary teacher non renewals and states that upon recommendation of the superintendent, the board of education may refuse to renew the contract of a probationary teacher or to reemploy any teacher for any cause that it deems sufficient as long as the cause is not arbitrary, capricious, or discriminatory or for political or personal reasons; and Policy 9205, Pest Management – Another newly proposed policy required by recent legislative action which must be placed in effect by January 2011. It ensures that the board of education is committed to maintaining a safe educational environment while also protecting the physical aspects of school facilities.

Candace Call, principal, Donna L. Loflin School, shared information about a pilot program to be implemented at Loflin to organize the fifth grade classes next year into single gender and co-ed classes.

Dr. Dot Harper provided the calendar of summer professional development for staff and summer school academics for students.

Mike Mize reported on summer capital projects planned and those already in motion by the Maintenance Department.

Following a 30-day review, the Board of Education approved a Strategic Plan for 2010-2013.

The Board approved the 2010 Graduation Guarantee as presented by Carla Freemyer which states that if an employer is not satisfied with a graduate's basic skills then the graduate would be offered free additional coursework.

Following a presentation by Pam Johnson, board members unanimously approved the local Academically or Intellectually Gifted (AIG) Plan for 2010-2013. The plan focuses on identifying students who need to be served as well as meeting the academic, social, and emotional needs of those students.

Harold Blair presented bids for installation of a wireless network solution for Asheboro High School, North and South Asheboro Middle Schools, and all five

elementary schools. The Board unanimously accepted the lowest responsive bid from Xirrus.

Mr. Blair requested the Board remove Budget Amendment CO-04 from the agenda. Board members approved the request.

Dr. Diane Frost noted important dates and times to remember: June 14, 2:20 p.m., Budget Presentation to County Commissioners; June 14, 6:30 p.m., Public Hearing on the Budget; June 21, 6:00 p.m., County Commissioners adopt a Budget for 2010-2011; and June 29, 5:30 p.m., Board of Education Summer Retreat.

Ms. Freemyer shared the Calendar of Events highlighting the following future dates: Breakfast and Convocation, August 20; Asheboro High School Hall of Fame night, September 17; and Asheboro High School Homecoming, October 15.

Ms. Freemyer presented the following *Points of Pride*: 285 students in the Class of 2010; 26 teachers selected for inaugural Teacher Leadership Academy; and NC Teaching Fellows Discovery Tour.

Board Operations

To accommodate those who are away during the week of July 4th, the Board unanimously approved changing the July board meeting from July 8 to July 15.

Board members received information to assist them in conducting the Superintendent's annual Performance Review for 2009-2010.
