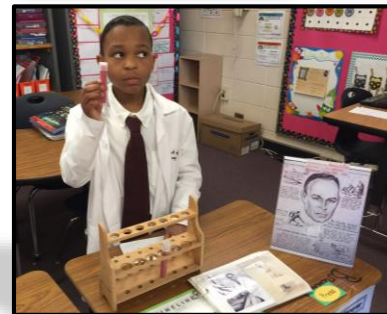
Parent Modules at DLL
