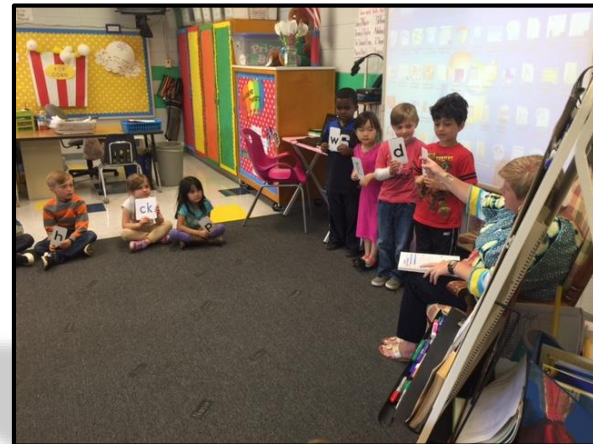
Letterland Visits to McCrory

Corey Comet’s Wellness Tips!

People who get a lot of exposure to ultraviolet (UV) rays are at greater risk for skin cancer. Limit your exposure to UV rays by seeking shade. It is important to limit your time in the sun between the hours of 10am and 4pm. You can protect your skin with clothing, by wearing a hat, and using sunglasses. Use a broad spectrum sunscreen with sun protection factor values of 30 or higher. And always be sure to avoid tanning beds and sun lamps!
