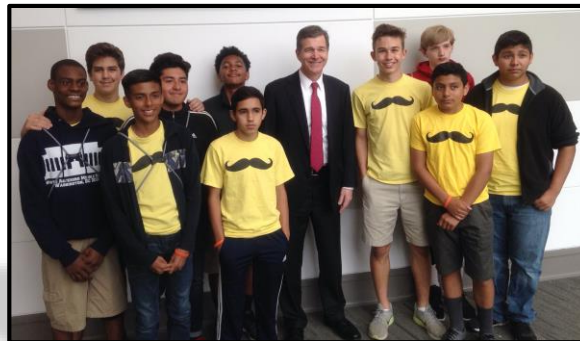


## Summer Teacher Internship Application
