Schools Recognized at PBIS Conference

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (**PBIS**) is a proactive approach to establishing the behavioral supports and social culture and needed for all students in a school to achieve social, emotional and academic success. Annually, the North Carolina PBIS Initiative recognizes schools for demonstrating fidelity in implementation and improved outcomes at the PBIS Recognition Celebration. We are pleased to announce that Asheboro City Schools has 7 schools earning recognition for the 2014-15 school year. The number of ACS schools earning recognition started with one school in 2010/11 and steadily increased to 7 schools. Two schools earned the highest level of state recognition for the first time in 2014-15 (South Asheboro Middle School and Guy B. Teachey Elementary).

The week also consisted of other fun events, including daily college trivia, a College Application Week Photo Booth, a visit from a Davidson College Admissions Officer, and College Spirit Day. Here are some exciting updates:

- AHS had 282 college applications submitted through CFNC during College Application Week.
- The senior class has submitted over 405 college applications so far this school year
- 203 of the 266 Seniors have submitted at least one college application.
 Many of the 203 that have submitted at least one application have submitted upwards of 5 or 10, and many of those who have not yet submitted an application have some in progress.
