

Annual Enrollment - Important to Enroll by October 31, 2017

The State Health Plan will conduct Annual Enrollment on September 30 thru October 31, 2017. The choices you make during this period will be effective January 1, 2018 - December 31, 2018. Important Reminders:

- If you do not complete the Open Enrollment, you will be enrolled in the 70/30 plan at the highest premium.
- If you want to pay the lowest premium, you <u>must</u> complete the tobacco attestation regardless of the plan you choose.
- If you are a new employee, you still <u>must</u> complete this enrollment to keep the lowest premium cost or choose the 80/20 plan.
- For steps on how to complete enrollment, click on the health insurance enrollment video attachment.
- This enrollment is for health insurance only. Enrollment for dental, vision, etc. will be in the spring.
- The Consumer Directed Health Plan (CDHP) <u>will not</u> be offered this year, you will need to choose between the 80/20 plan or the 70/30 plan.

Important: During Open Enrollment, <u>all</u> active members and eligible dependents will automatically be enrolled into the Traditional 70/30 Plan. If you want to reduce your premium or enroll in the 80/20 Plan, then you <u>must</u> take action during Open Enrollment. If you do not participate in the enrollment, you will be placed on the 70/30 Plan with a \$85/month deduction plus any deduction you may have for dependent coverage.



AHS Receives Monies for Global Navigator Scholarships

Asheboro High School has been chosen to receive \$25,000 in Global Navigator Scholarships! This monetary award is made possible on behalf of donor Sheron Long and the Council on International Educational Exchange (CIEE). The scholarships are intended to open the world to students, helping them navigate across languages, connect with other cultures, and impact global/local issues in today's interconnected world. These awards are for students to study abroad next summer. Any student graduating in 2019, 2020, or 2021 is eligible to apply for a scholarship through <u>CIEE</u>: Council on International Educational Exchange.
