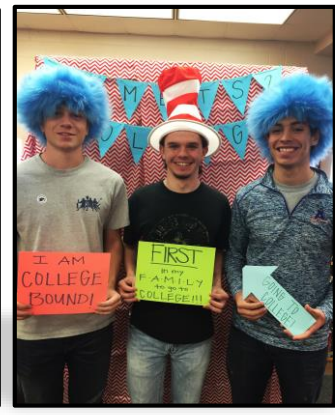
Lindley Park Hosts Heritage Night

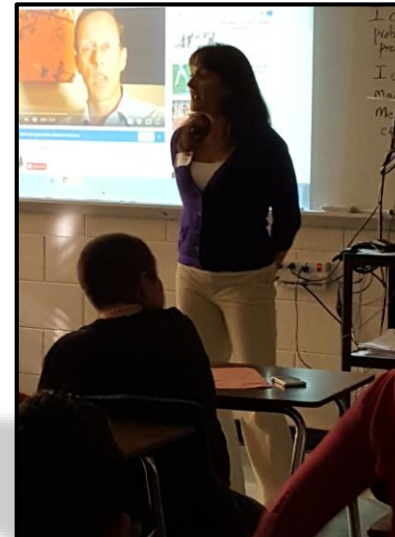
ESL Night at SAMS
