ACS Teaching Grant Opportunities

Asheboro City Schools invites all teachers to submit teaching mini-grant proposals for funding consideration for the 2016-2017 school year. Teachers may apply individually or in groups. Each request should not exceed \$750. ACS Teaching Grants are not intended to provide materials and/or equipment to implement regular instructional programs. Grant proposals must include the cover sheet and be no more than five double-spaced typed pages in length. Please submit five copies to the Central Office by Friday, October 7, 2016. Criteria for the grant proposals should include:

- Rationale for the project (how project <u>enhances/enriches</u> the North Carolina Standards and alignment with the ACS Strategic Plan/school's Continuous Improvement Plan);
- Goals for the project (how goals will be <u>measured</u> to determine the impact on student achievement);
- 3. A brief overview of the project activities, including a timeline;
- 4. Evaluation strategies used to determine if project goals are met;
- Description of digital artifact(s), e.g. video, podcast, photo movie, to be shared with administration, staff, and the Board of Education;
- 6. Projected budget indicating what materials or resources will be necessary to carry out your project and meet your goals.
