Information on the Physics First Sequence at Asheboro High School was presented by Dr. Julie Pack and the team of teachers at Asheboro High School who researched the proposal. The proposal would pair Physics with Math II and Physical Science with Math I for Freshmen. This pairing will be used to:

- Increase opportunity for application of a concept,
- Foster deeper understanding and retention of information,
- Provide more opportunity to build critical thinking skills,
- Increase student success in introductory science and math courses.
