Dr. Hazel Frick presented the following policies for 30-day review: Policy 2120, Code of Ethics for School Board Members - Updated to meet General Assembly requirements that board members meet ethical requirements. Policy 2123, Board Member Opportunities for Development - The policy has been updated to contain information about board members' requirements to receive at least two hours of ethics education within twelve months of election to office. Policy 4115, Behavior Standards for Transfer Students – A provision has been added that students under suspension or expulsion who have been identified as having a disability pursuant to IDEA and who otherwise meet the requirements for enrollment in the school district are entitled to services to the extent provided by law. Policy 4120, Domicile or Residence Requirements - The addition to the policy describes admission eligibility of students with disabilities who are currently under a suspension or expulsion in another school district.

Action Items

Following a 30-day review, the following policies were approved by the Board: Policy 7520 – Family Medical Leave; Policy 7530 – Military Leave; and Policy 7550 – Absences Due to Inclement Weather.

The Board unanimously approved Budget Amendment CO-03 setting aside an additional \$100,000 as the year closes in case of any arising emergencies.

The Board unanimously approved an overnight outof-state field trip request from the Asheboro High School Student Council to travel to the National Association of Student Councils' Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana.
