Carla Freemyer reviewed upcoming dates and events for the strategic planning process for Asheboro City Schools. "Coffee and Conversation" events will be held across the community on different dates to gather input from all stakeholders on top issues the system should address for the next three years.

Dr. Dot Harper shared information on a new partnership with the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. Asheboro City Schools will partner with UNC-G to develop future elementary and exceptional education teachers.

Dr. Hazel Frick presented the following policies for 30day review: Policy 1710/4021/7230 - Prohibition against Discrimination, Harassment, and Bullying including Hazing. This policy, with board approval,

will be replaced with the North Carolina School Boards Association's policy. The policy prohibits unlawful discrimination and harassment along with bullying and hazing by students, employees, volunteers, and visitors during any school function. The Policy 1720/4015/7225 – Discrimination, Harassment, and Bullying Complaint Procedure, with board approval, will replace two Asheboro City Schools' policies. The policy provides a detailed outline of steps required for reporting and investigating complaints in compliance with federal requirements.

Action Items

The Board unanimously approved the 2008-2009 Audit as presented by Harold Blair. The audit was conducted and received a qualified "clean" opinion from the accounting firm of Cherry, Bekaert & Holland.

Mr. Blair shared information on a new benefit proposal for Asheboro City Schools employees, a 457 Plan investment option which will allow employees their accumulated funds penalty free before age 59 and a half. The Board unanimously approved the plan investment option as presented.

Board member, Chris Yow, reviewed the 2010 Legislative Platform highlighting the key priorities as proposed by the Legislative Committee: Maintaining local control, adequate funding from the state, and support for public schools. The Board unanimously approved the Legislative Platform as presented.

Superintendent's Report/Calendar of Events

Carla Freemyer shared the Calendar of Events pointing out important dates as follows: Board Appreciation Lunch, January 22, 2010; District Spelling Bee, February 16, 2010; Asheboro High School Children's Theatre, February 21, 2010; and Asheboro High School hosting the North Carolina Student Council Convention, March 4 and 5, 2010.

At the retreat board members will focus on the following topics: New Gifted Education Standards; Comprehensive Review of Career and Technical Education Programs – Preparing for Future Smaller Learning Communities; Health and Wellness Initiatives; Strategic Planning Mission, Vision, and Core Values; Long Range Facilities Planning; New Teacher Evaluation Instrument; Race to the Top; and Preparing for the 21st Century Learner.
